Think about whether it is a fictional story or non-fictional book?

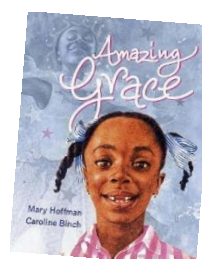
Who are the main characters?

WRITING

Can you make a story map for a story book you know well? For example: The little Red Hen, Tiddler, Three Billy Goats Gruff or The Detective Dog?



Remember use arrows to show which way the story flows. Here is an example to refresh your memories! Think back to the story maps we've made and used in class before.

Once you've finished your story-map see if you can write the story out. Use adjective, adjective (A,A) to describe your characters and the setting. Use adverbs and verbs to make your story more exciting! We would love to see your story-maps and read your tales, so take a pic and show us on ClassDojo! We will be rewarding with Dojo

points!

We would also like it if you could make a character information book. Can you draw, then write descriptions of your favourite characters from some of your favourite stories or traditional tales? You could make a front cover with a title, author and illustrator's name. Then a contents page inside, letting readers know which page to turn to if they want to find out information about the Giraffe, the Pelly and the Monkey from 'The Giraffe, Pelly and me' by Roald Dahl for example!

Practise joining your handwriting, using the joins you've learnt in school. Practise your spellings as often as possible.

You all have a Purple Mash log in too, which has lots of online learning activities that you're all familiar with.

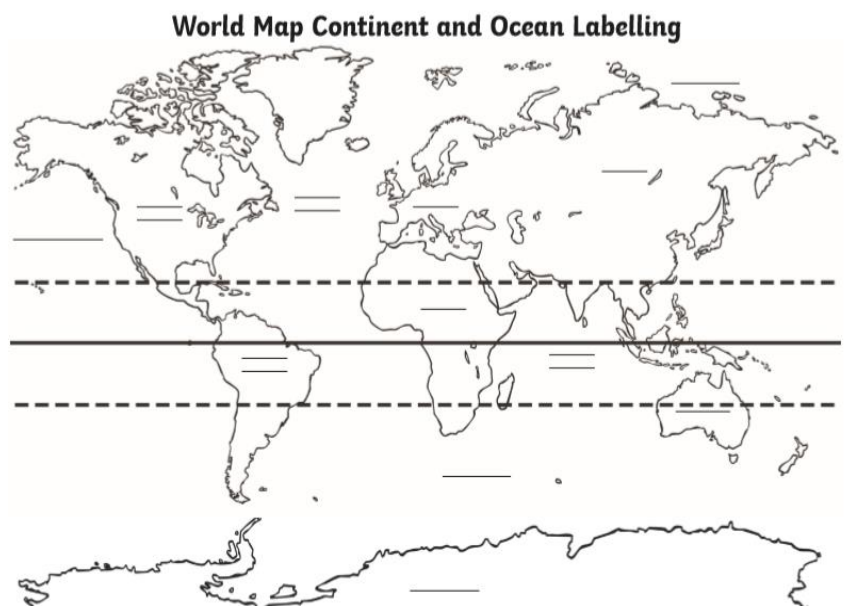
