WORLD BOOK DAY 2025





SAFER INTERNET DAY

On the 11th February the pupils across the school took part in Safer Internet Day. The theme of the day was 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online'. Each class took part in an assembly, looking at the scams they may see on their devices and what they can do when they see them. There was also time to talk about trusted adults they can talk to if they see something that worries them online at school and at home.

The children took part in a range of activities, provided by the UK Internet Safety Centre, that helped them to think about how to spot a scam and the emotions they would feel. The Year 6 pupils also discussed the term 'Phishing' and learnt how to spot this online. We recognise that staying safe online is a hugely important issue. It is something that we regularly discuss as part of our regular computing lessons not just on Safer Internet Day.
