Head Teacher Weekly Update

This week has been our termly Assessment week at school. I always say that school is generally very calm, but due to the Assessment week, it has been even quieter and calmer than usual. The purpose of this is to expose children to test situations, and to inform Teachers in relation to what children know and can remember in a test situation, thus highlighting what needs to be a focus again for the whole class and children as individuals.

This week has also seen us monitor Design and Technology in school. Miss Brotherhood leads DT and has been looking at children's work in lessons, and speaking to children, each Monday afternoon which is when our wider curriculum (subject) monitoring takes place. This has been positive and we also have a few next steps for further improvement following this. I am also in the process of developing this subject on the website, and our next steps will be noted in the 'impact' section for this subject.

On Tuesday, we welcomed Mrs Montgomery-Smith to school, as part of our handover process, before she begins in April (after Easter) to replace Miss Morton during her maternity leave. She met with myself about the Assistant Headteacher role, and also met with Miss Morrison (SENDCo and Year 1 partner Teacher). She also met other staff and children throughout the school and we look forward to Mrs Montgomery-Smith starting in the Summer Term.

On Wednesday, Mr Prince monitored Mastering Number sessions in the younger classes. This has been implemented this year to improve understanding of basic number. Our INSET Day is a focus on this after Easter (Monday 15th April, 2024).

On Tuesday and Wednesday, it was also pleasing to see many parents showing a keen interest in their children's learning when they attended Parent Consultation meetings. I hope these were useful in terms of knowing about your child's progress, as well as their future targets for the Summer Term. We also look forward to welcoming parents into classrooms next week (Tuesday at 2.45pm) for your children to share their work.

At the time of writing (Thursday afternoon), I have just returned to school following an educational visit to the Royal Cornwall Showground related to farming for our Melbur Class. They had a lovely day and learnt a lot in relation to this area of the curriculum.

I am also looking forward to Bingo this evening, which is one of our fundraising events, which this time is for Year 6 end of year celebrations before they move to secondary school. Thank you to Mrs Houston and Miss Tucker for organising this, and thank you to parents and families for your donations, these events would not be able to run without you!

Finally, a reminder that next week is a four day week at school (Monday to Thursday) as Friday is Good Friday (Bank Holiday) and is therefore the beginning of the Easter holiday. 
Book Look

Cancelled Clubs

INSET Days 2024/25

This week, I have started to think about INSET Days for the next academic year (2024-25). I always like to share these with parents as soon as possible. These are not set yet, and won't be until May or June, but advance notice that I expect our INSET Days for 2024-25 to be: Tuesday 3rd September, 2024; Wednesday 4th September, 2024; Monday 4th November, 2024 (TPAT INSET Day); Monday 6th January, 2025; and Friday 6th June, 2025. I hope this advance notice of our expected INSET Days helps parents to plan childcare, etc... on these days when school is closed to children.



Attendance Policy / Strategy

This week, Governors have approved the TPAT attendance policy and strategy, which have had some slight adaptations at school level whereby we were required to add information relevant to Nanpean School. This can now be seen on our school website: http://www.nanpean.comwall.sch.uk/website/key_pol icies /538453. It would be useful for all parents to read this so that they are aware of expectations for attendance at Nanpean School. One of the main changes for us is how we will look at attendance. Previously, we simply considered the child's attendance percentage, and, of course, we will continue to do this. However, in future, we will also be considering 'broken weeks' of attendance, with a broken week being a week whereby the child is not at school for each of the five school days. If this is over a certain level in a half term or term, letters will also now be sent to parents. This is because nationally, the Department for Education expect children to be in school, and feel it is extremely rare for children to be too unwell to attend school frequently, such as absent one week, then again the next week or week after, for example.

Drinnick Class Scientists

In Drinnick class over the last couple of weeks we have been learning about ecosystems in our local area. We have been exploring our woodlands and the pond area and carried out different types of research such as tally charts, sketches, samples and photographs. We worked in pairs, then shared our findings with the whole class. Some of us saw some tiny frogs hiding in the pond area, while others spotted lots of spiders and other creepy crawlies! We were all great at spotting clues such as tracks and burrows to help us work out what type of animal might have lived there. We enjoyed discovering how the variety of insects and animals that live alongside each other within our school grounds. Afterwards, we were able to present our data using pictograms and bar charts.





Parking Around School Site

A reminder that there should be NO PARKING on the Zig-Zag lines at the front of the school site. These lines have been marked to keep ALL visitors to the school site safe, including children coming and going each day. Please do not park in this area and cause an obstruction.

Adult Behaviour
