## Head Teacher Weekly Update

It was lovely to finally see some sunshine last weekend and this week at times (especially at the start of the week).

It was great to see Summer Term extra-curricular activities (often referred to as 'clubs') beginning this week, and I enjoyed the first session of my 'club' (Athletics) after school today (as I write this on Thursday evening). I often compare our offer to that of other schools, and feel we offer a good range of opportunities and experiences, at no additional cost to families, and these are often better than, or at least on a par with, schools that are much bigger than us.

This week has been a strange week, as I was not in school for nearly two full days (Monday and Wednesday) this week.

This was due to me being at other schools within our trust (TPAT) as part of the partnership where Headteacher's visit other schools to network and share ideas, and to support other schools regarding school improvement.

On Monday, we had our weekly staff meeting (instead of Wednesday) as this was the Trust Behaviour Lead sharing ideas and expectations in relation to the TPAT Behaviour Policy, which is about to be released and will then be adapted at school before being approved by Governors. Once this is complete, I will let parents know that it has been updated and is available on our website.

On Tuesday, the Trust SEND Lead visited school for his termly visit. This was positive in relation to provision, while also giving a few further ideas that will now be actioned by Miss Morrison as SENDCo, in conjunction with class teacher.

When I returned to school on Wednesday, I had a meeting with Grammarsaurus in relation to Curriculum planning and beginning to think about the next academic year (beginning in September 2024).

Unfortunately, this busy start to the week meant that I didn't send out Curriculum Learning Maps for this term until the end of the week instead of nearer the beginning of the week as originally planned. These were sent via Class Dojo and also will be available on our website by the end of next week. I always enjoy reading these and sharing them with the school community so that you are able to see what children will be learning and experiencing this term.

At the time of writing (Thursday evening), I am looking forward to meeting with our Chair of Governors (Mark Tucker) tomorrow, as we try to catch up every few weeks, so this is our first meeting of the Summer Term.

# Rosemellyn Incinerator Visit

"Year 6 recently visited the Cornish Economic Recycling Centre in St Dennis. The incinerator processes and burns the waste collected from all over Cornwall, and can get up to 2200 degrees Celsius. It can turn waste into energy that powers our electric items such as internet, cookers and fridges.
